

Choose your audience

Talking to Republicans, Independents, Undecideds and Democrats requires speaking four different languages. Before you prepare to hit the streets decide which group you can be most effective with and hone your message to them. Door knocking is about 33% effective. It is by far the most effective means of communicating our message. I think your PCs can give you lists of the doors to knock on and registration information.

Door Knocking Tips

- > Know your talking points
- Practice before you go out, video record it
- Wear a professional looking name tag
- Ask for the person on your list but talk to whoever answers the door
- You are a likeable, sympathetic listener

Door Knocking Tips

- > Be complimentary I love your flowerbed
- > Ask what issues are important now wait & listen
- > Avoid asking yes or no questions
- Find the second seco
- > Avoid direct argument, create cognitive dissonance (more on that later)

Door Knocking Tips

- I'm leaning Democrat oh, which policies do like most – listen – how is that helping you?
- > I'm afraid of where we're heading, are you?
- Have voter registration forms with you
- If voter too argumentative, politely excuse yourself, don't waste time with them
- Best times: Weekends or weekdays midmorning or evening

Get Republicans voting

- Contact every Republican: push them to vote
- Offer help: a ride, help with ballot, babysitting
- Make sure they know our candidates names and how great they are
- Make sure to include the down the ballot, the local candidates
- > Be a great cheerleader: fire 'em up
- Get their number: call back to remind them

Get Republicans activated

- Go beyond getting out the vote
- At every opportunity ask them to become involved
- > Door knocking in twos, invite them to join you
- A pro & a newbie better than two pros together, it doubles our numbers
- Once trained, ask them to recruit a newbie of their own and you find a new one
- Keep in touch and keep 'em fired up

Heart and Head

The young and inexperienced love socialism because they have a heart, when they mature they hate socialism because they also have a brain.

Cognitive Dissonance

> It's the key to changing minds > Arguments seldom change minds > A friend asking questions can > Be the friend that asks questions > Don't argue, make a sympathetic statement and ask a question > Share their concern but ask if there might not be a better solution

Cognitive Dissonance

- We need to treat minorities better
- I agree, but I worry we are signaling that they need help because they are less capable.
 How do you think we could signal that they don't need help since they are equally capable?

Talking to Independents

- > Don't wear party affiliation
- > What issues are important to you?
- I see we both care about that, do you think Biden's team is helping?
- I think Biden may care as much as you and I do but I worry that he's going about it in a way that is making things worse, what do you think?
- My family was better off a couple of years ago, how about yours?
- > Avoid calling Dem candidates by name

Talking to Undecideds

> Undecided are like Independents but may need more comparisons > I've been undecided before, I try and find the facts > More law and order or less? > More illegal immigration or less? > More inflation or less? **Kids gender being changed or not?** Schools teaching political beliefs or more academic subject?

Talking to Democrats (if you must)

> What issues are important to you? > Is Biden headed the right way on it? > Is your family better off under Biden? You and I really care about people but co-dependency does not help people, it keeps them down I used to be a Democrat but they lost me at defunding police and no cash bail and gender changing children

Republican Unity

- Look today for who we will run 6 to 10 years from now
- Recruit and train promising school board candidates, county officials and JPs and get them elected
- Develop a deep bench, with dozens of excellent prospects who can run for higher office in the future
- Then we can choose the best of the best
